

NIHO TANIWHA

The Niho Taniwha starts with a whāriki of values, tikanga and evidence. Three Wāhi Ako help us to ladder outcomes and learning up and down between our collective moemoea, different programmes and mahi on the ground.



NHO TANIWHA KAUPAPA



Our work is about reconnecting to tangata whenua and Pasifika innovation to support social and economic transformation.

> The Niho Taniwha is a values-led set of practices, that weave learning and evaluation through the innovation process. It is developed from working with whānau, communities and systems. It is grounded in Aotearoa and draws respectfully from mātauranga Māori.

The Niho Taniwha pattern has a rich whakapapa in Aotearoa and across the Pacific and helps locate us in Tāmaki Makaurau today.






THROUGHTHE NIHO TANIWHA WE...




