



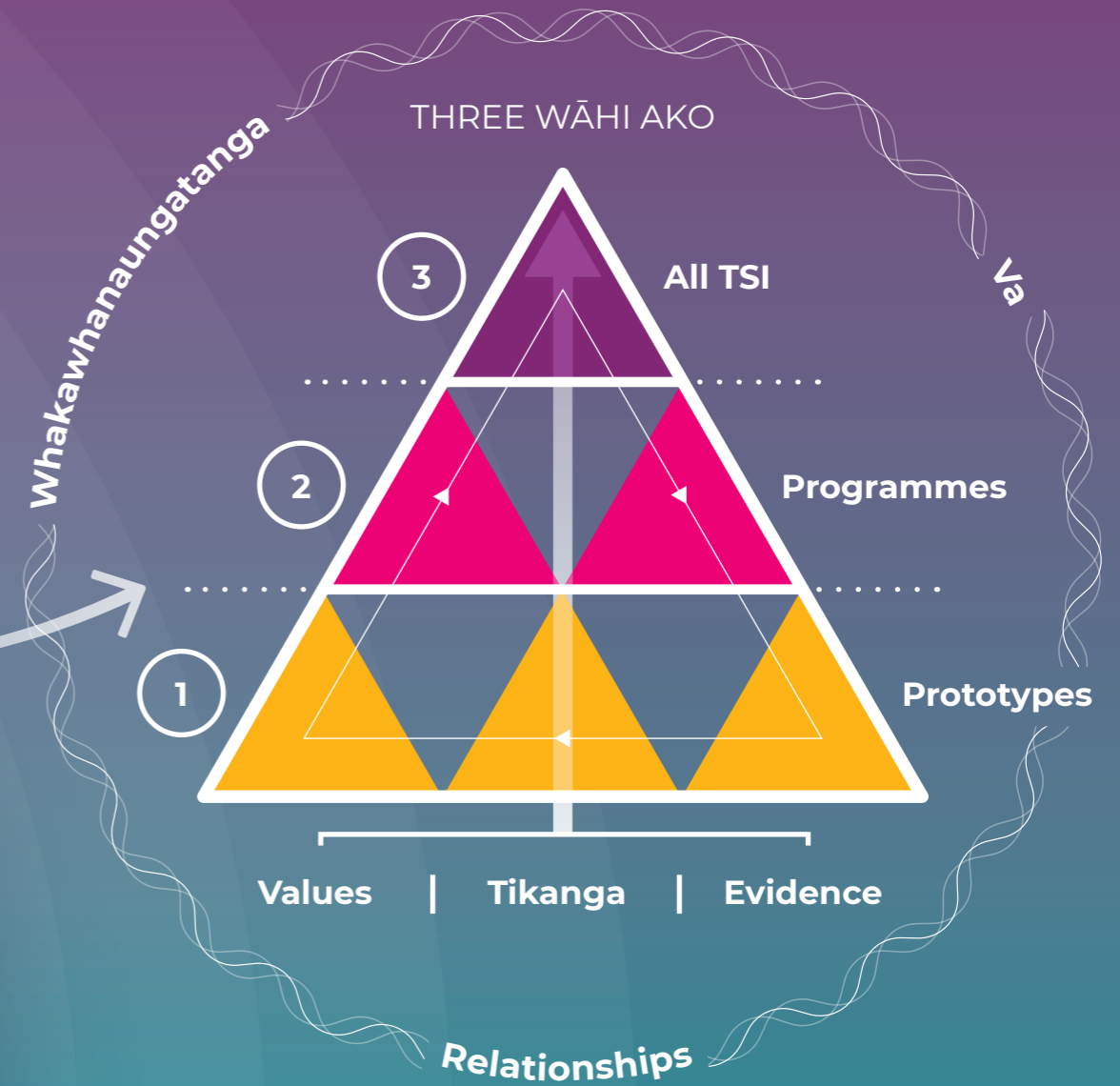
NIHO TANIWHA

A FRAMEWORK FOR NAVIGATING COMPLEXITY

The Niho Taniwha ('teeth of the taniwha') is a framework to help us navigate social change journeys. It helps us to chart our paths, read tohu, learn and adapt as we go.



LEARNING TO TRACK AND TRACKING TO LEARN



NIHO TANIWHA

The Niho Taniwha starts with a whāriki of values, tikanga and evidence. Three Wāhi Ako help us to ladder outcomes and learning up and down between our collective moemoea, different programmes and mahi on the ground.

NIHO TANIWHA Δ KAUPAPA

Our work is about reconnecting to tangata whenua and Pasifika innovation to support social and economic transformation.

The Niho Taniwha is a values-led set of practices, that weave learning and evaluation through the innovation process. It is developed from working with whānau, communities and systems. It is grounded in Aotearoa and draws respectfully from mātauranga Māori.

The Niho Taniwha pattern has a rich whakapapa in Aotearoa and across the Pacific and helps locate us in Tāmaki Makaurau today.

- ▶ Foreground **indigenous knowledge, place and lived experience**
- ▶ Lead with **values, principles and tikanga**
- ▶ **Act and learn together** with whānau and systems partners
- ▶ **Generate practice-based** data and **evidence**
- ▶ Frame mahi in a complexity and **systems transformation** context
- ▶ **Track what matters** to whānau and communities

Learning and outcomes at programme level, developed with whānau and partners from mahi on the ground.

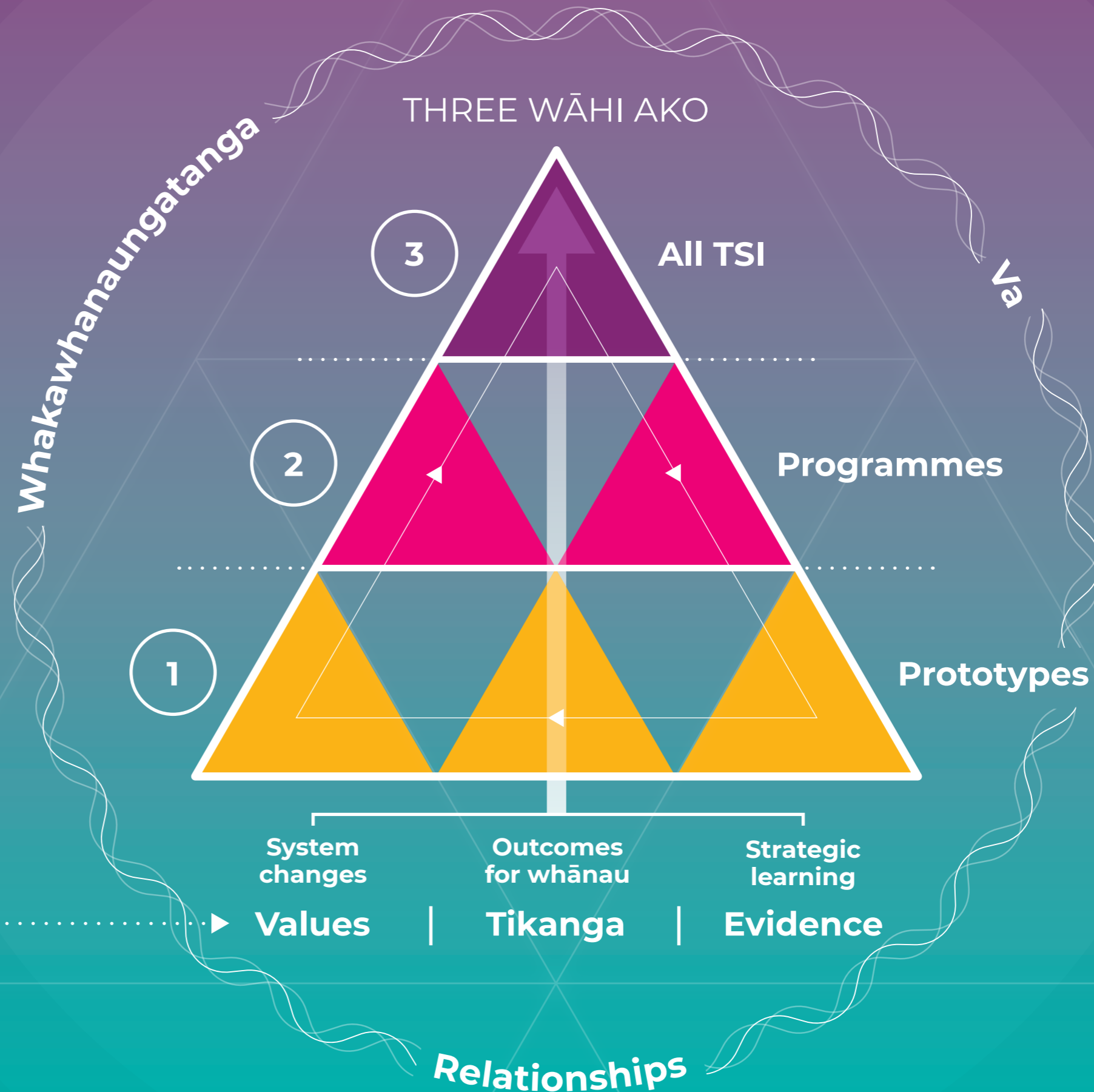
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Wāhi Ako Tahī Zone 1

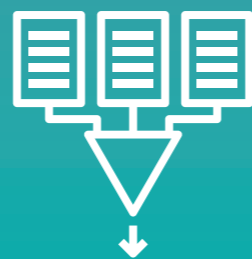

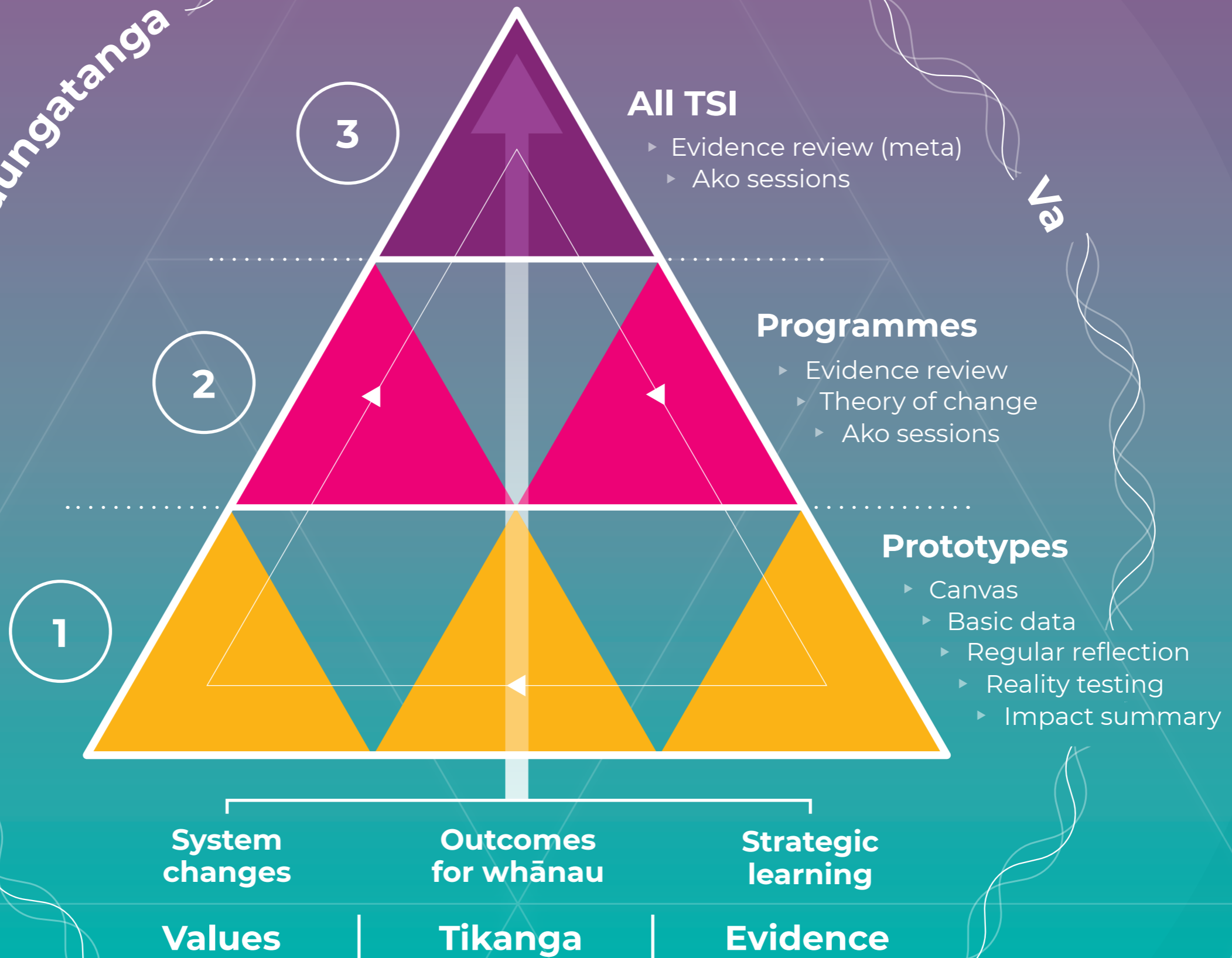

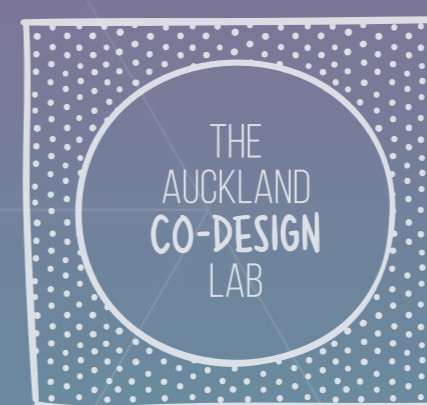
