‘public policy is the set of activities that governments engage in for the purpose of changing their economy and society’

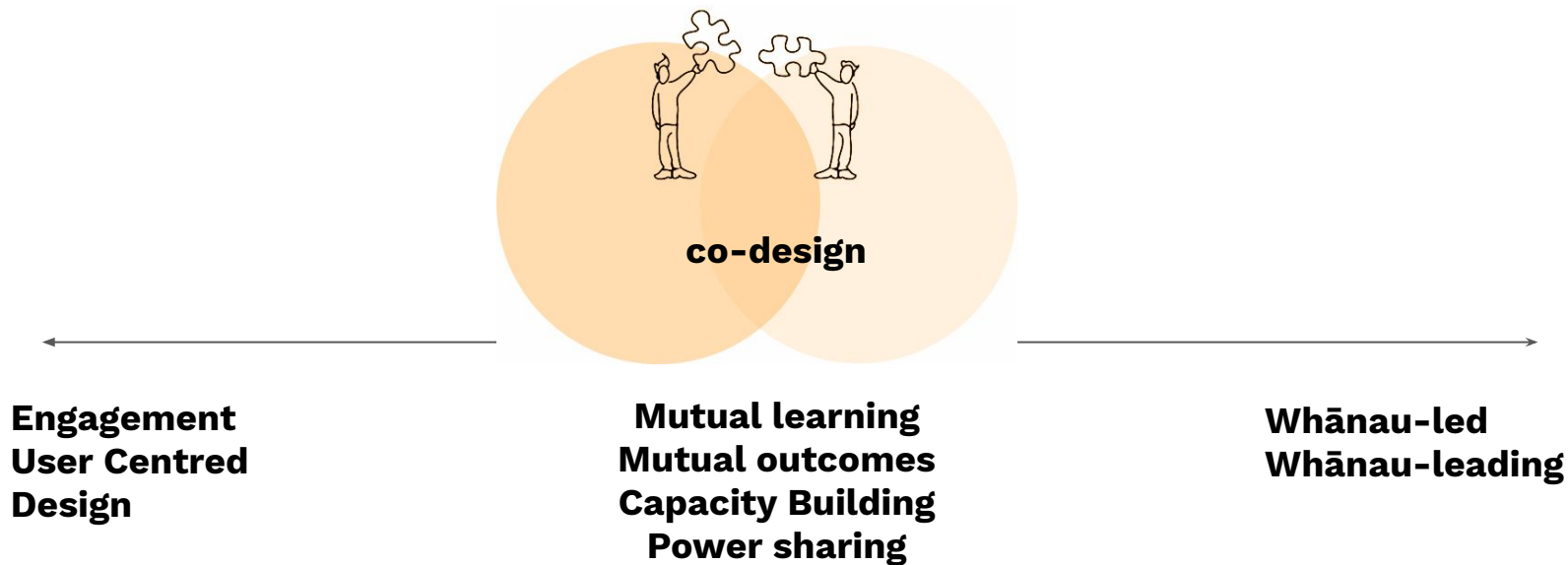
